Modifications vs Accommodations - in elementary school, a student may have had "Modified Curriculum Expectations" which means they were working on curriculum for a different grade level. In high school, curriculum is NOT modified - instead we offer "Accommodations", which are teaching strategies that will help students to be successful in their grade. Students also choose which level of course (Open, Applied, or Academic) to take; if a student had "Modified Curriculum" in Grade 8, they should take Applied classes in Grade 9.

IPRC - The Identification,
Placement, and Review Committee
is the annual meeting with
parents/guardians, ISS teachers,
and administration, during which a
student's placement and IEP are
discussed and developed as
required.

IEP - Individualized Education Plan, a legal document which lists a student's Area of Exceptionality and the Accommodations teachers use to support students' individual needs.
