What is this course about?

This course is compulsory for the French Immersion program as it is the study of the language itself.

In this course, we will be studying the four strands of the language: speaking, listening, reading and writing.

This course is run in a more self-driven manner in terms of which types of works are studied and how students would like to improve their French. Early in the semester, students are presented with a number of projects and they will choose which they would like to do and in which order. This requires both self-advocacy and self-determination to better their French through this work.









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What will I be doing in class?

Speaking (20%)

- could include a series of personal vocabulary tasks that would each tackle a common speaking point and would include assessment on the implemention of new words

 all stages of writing will be completed in class and using a
- pencil, paper, and dictionaries available in the classroom small study units on various grammar concepts will be
- introduced and implemented into writing projects

Course Assessments
